...We will be celebrating All Souls Day on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of November. Also, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of November at 7:00PM, we will be inviting the families and friends of those who were buried from our Church during this past year to come together for a special remembrance liturgy. All parishioners are welcomed to attend as well.

We ordered a couple of them from the company to taste them and they were very delicious. You must order them by November 10<sup>th</sup> and they must be paid in full at the time of the order. ### NEW JERSEY'S ADOPTION LAW HAS CHANGED

Beginning January 2, 2017, adoptees and certain relatives will be able to obtain a copy of their original birth certificate without a court order. The birth certificate will include the names of the birth parents who placed children for adoption unless a birth parent requests their name be omitted.

Birth parents who wish to preserve their privacy must submit a **Redaction Request Form** which can be obtained by calling 866-649-8726, ext. 582 or downloading it at <http://nj.gov/health/forms/reg-36c.pdf>.

The Catholic Church has always supported reunions between adoptees and birth parents, if such reunions were by mutual consent. The Church continues to do so through their Catholic Charities agencies.
